Implant Type	Computer Guided	Immediate	Freehand
Description	Using the latest technology, the implant is virtually placed in your 3D x-ray. This is then used to make a custom guide which facilitates ease & precision placement of your implant.	Tooth is taken out and implant is placed in on the same day.	Dentist uses his experience to guess were vital structures and bone are to free hand place implant.
Guaranteeable	Yes – technology allows for ideal & predictable implant placement.	No- Greater chance of implant failure	No- great chance of implant failure
Timeline	If tooth was recently taken out, you must wait a minimum of 4-6 months for the site to be ready.	Time can be saved as implant can be placed same day	If tooth was recently taken out, you must wait a minimum of 4-6 months for the site to be ready
Procedure	Computer guide allows the procedure to take only half the time and difficulty as other types.	Technique sensitive as tooth socket is not the same shape as an implant	Take 2x longer but does save money. This is how most implants are placed today.
Recovery	Quickest and least possibility of complications.	Care must be taken to keep clean as site heals	Often stitches will need to be used.
Cost	Additional cost of only the charge we pay for the fabrication of the computer guide.	Cheaper	Cheaper
